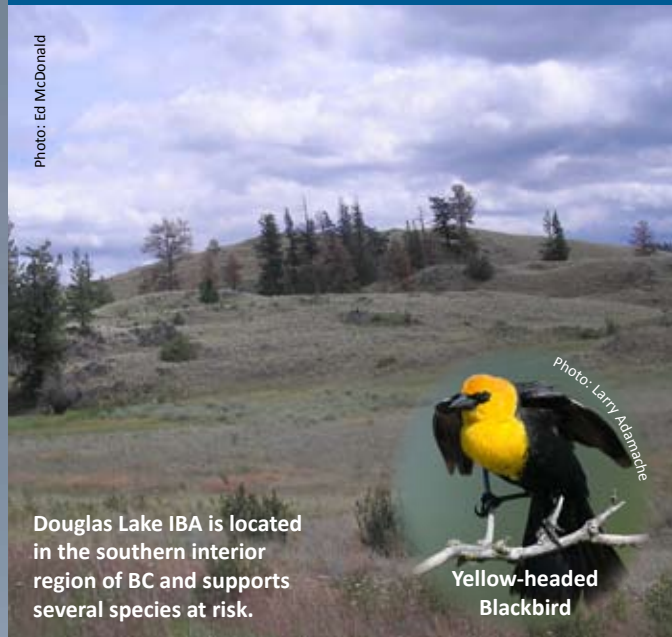

Important Bird Areas (IBA's) in BC provide birds with secure habitat for overwintering and nesting, and safe places to rest and feed during migration.
